II. General Description of the rotation:

A week long intensive and immersive seminar focusing on enhancing the learner's teaching versatility and ability to analyze a teaching session while creating a forum for collegial exchange. To do this, we will discuss medical education literature, participate in role plays and engage in interactive minilectures. The only pre-requisite to the course is a desire to learn; no projects are assigned and no previous knowledge of educational theory is required.

Daily schedule will include twice a day two-hour long seminar sessions, along with time spent for journal club. A few sessions are blocked off to debrief about teaching sessions that will be completed during the week.
